We have explored writing in a lot of different ways by creating imaginative, informative



Sick Bay & Water Bottles


With the arrival of hot weather we have had some heat affected students feeling unwell. It has highlighted the problem of students not bringing in water bottles and forgetting to drink.

Please remember to pack their water bottle every day as due to COVID restrictions students are not to use the bubblers and the office cannot continuously supply cups.


Donations of Icy Poles and Zooper Doopers would be greatly appreciated from families if you are able to assist.
