Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Education Week is an annual celebration of NSW public education and the achievements of local schools and students. During Education Week we recognise work of the whole school community and the important roles people play to enable students to reach their full potential. We recognise the important roles of community members, teachers and support staff who are dedicated to our school community. Whilst education continues daily at school, with the current COVID restrictions in place, we have tentatively re-scheduled several regular education week activities till Term 4 Week 4 in the hope that restrictions maybe eased by then.

This year's theme is 'Lifelong Learners' and celebrates education as a lifelong journey from before a child enters an early childhood setting, progressing to primary and secondary school, and continuing their learning journey into adulthood; learning a trade, entering tertiary education, or the workforce.

We will still be holding our book week parade in Week 6 in line with Covid regulations, but will postpone our book fair till Education Week.

Covid Update reminder for all schools and families:

It is important that schools and families continue to follow the COVID-19 guidelines outlined on this page. In particular we wish to highlight the following:

- ⇒ Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms should be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.
- ⇒ Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested and selfisolate until a negative result is received. Locations of testing clinics are available via the NSW government website.

Schools must continue to implement:

- ⇒ Personal hygiene, physical distancing, cleaning and record keeping practices
- ⇒ Where possible to use outdoor areas weather permitting or large open spaces to enable adequate physical distancing.
- ⇒ All visitors to a school site must be well and symptom free, comply with sign-in arrangements, and the 1.5m physical distancing requirements.
- ⇒ Visitors to schools should maintain 1.5m distance from other people where Remain outside of school grounds, but if essential to enter school grounds please follow mask wearing requirements and sign in using the Service NSW QR code when entering the school at the front office.





Novel study - 'Unbearable' by Paul Jennings




Word study - Greek and Latin root words
