With the end of term approaching, I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a happy and safe holiday and we look forward to welcoming everyone back for a fun-filled term 4!




Our school cleaner Zac has reverted to cleaning in the mornings now, which is more convenient for the classrooms and OOSH. If you see any issues around please let us know.




